Lesson Introduction

God created the sun to give light and warmth to the earth. Without the sun there would be no life on earth. The earth turns around on its axis each day. When the part of the earth we live on faces the sun it is day. When the part where we live is turned away from the sun it is night. (Follow the instructions in the lesson activities to demonstrate this.)

God also created all the stars out in the heavens. We can see the stars at night when the sun isn't shining. Stars are like the sun they are just farther away. They are very hot and give off lots of light. That is why we can see them even though they are a very, very long way away. God made the sun for the daylight and he made the moon and stars to shine at night.

<u>Day 3</u>: What makes the moon shine? Why does the moon change shape?

Day 4: Why can we see the stars at night and not in the day? How are stars like the sun?

<u>Day 5</u>: Where did the stars come from? What does God know about each star?

<u>Day 6</u>: What does it mean that the universe goes on and on? What does it mean that God holds the universe in his hands? What should looking at the stars cause us to do? Why?



Day 6

Draw a picture of the stars in God's hands.

<u>Jeremiah 10:12</u>: ¹² But God made the earth by his power; he founded the world by his wisdom and stretched out the heavens by his understanding.

<u>Isaiah 40:28</u>: ²⁸ Do you not know? Have you not heard? The LORD is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He will not grow tired or weary, and his understanding no one can fathom.

Day 5

As people gaze at stars they think in patterns they take shape. Can you see a dipper or a hunter with a cape? And do you know that God calls each of them by name? He created each and every star, not one of them the same.

Draw a picture of the big dipper or a constellation.

Day 2

Draw a picture of the sun and earth.

<u>Job 9:8-10</u>: ⁸ He alone stretches out the heavens and treads on the waves of the sea. ⁹ He is the Maker of the Bear and Orion, the Pleiades and the constellations of the south. ¹⁰ He performs wonders that cannot be fathomed, miracles that cannot be counted. <u>Psalm 74:16-17</u>: ¹⁶ The day is yours, and yours also the night; you established the sun and moon. ¹⁷ It was you who set all the boundaries of the earth; you made both summer and winter.

Day 3

<u>Psalm 104:19-20</u>: ¹⁹ The moon marks off the seasons, and the sun knows when to go down. ²⁰ You bring darkness, it becomes night, and all the beasts of the forest prowl.

<u>Isaiah 40:26</u>: ²⁶ Lift your eyes and look to the heavens: Who created all these? He who brings out the starry host one by one, and calls them each by name. Because of his great power and mighty strength, not one of them is missing.
