Lesson Rhyme

This coming Sunday is Palm Sunday. On Palm Sunday Jesus rode into the city of Jerusalem on a donkey. It is the Sunday before Easter. On Easter we celebrate Jesus rising from the dead after they hung him on the cross.

When Jesus rode into the city on a donkey people shouted praises to him and waved palm branches. They said, "Hosanna to the Son of David." They even laid their cloaks on the ground like he was a king.

The people knew about Jesus. They knew he healed people and taught them about God. They thought he was a king who could save them from their enemies, the Romans.

In just a few days the people would change their minds about Jesus. Instead of calling him their savior they would tell the rulers to crucify him. The people didn't understand who Jesus was. They didn't know that Jesus came to save us from our sin and give us eternal life.

Discussion Questions

<u>Day 2</u>: What is a king? How is Jesus a king? How did the people honor Jesus as a king? How should we honor Jesus as our king? <u>Day 3</u>: What does it mean to praise Jesus? Why should we praise Jesus? How should we praise Jesus? What does it mean to have a

cold and dark heart? Why doesn't a person with a cold and dark heart want to praise Jesus?

<u>Day 4</u>: What did Jesus say would cause the rocks and stones to cry out with praise? Who should always praise Jesus? Why?

<u>Day 5</u>: What is the gift Jesus has given us? What does that mean? <u>Day 6</u>: What does Jesus want to do form you? What does that mean? What would keep Jesus from being your king?
