Daily Reading Questions

Note: The questions were written from the wording in the NIV 1984. If you are using a different Bible translation, they may have to be adapted.

Digging Deeper: What does fruit reveal?

Reading 1: Matthew 12:33-37 A tree is recognized by its fruit.

What does it mean that a tree is recognized by its fruit? What does a good man produce? Why? What does a bad man produce? Why? What do verses 36-37 mean?

Reading 2: Matthew 7:15-23 A bad tree bears bad fruit.

What is a false prophet? How do you recognize a false prophet? What does that mean? What is evidence of good fruit?

Reading 3: John 15:1-8

Bearing fruit is evidence of connection to the vine.

What does God do to the branch that doesn't bear fruit? What does that mean he does? How does a branch bear fruit? What does it mean that Jesus is the vine and we are the branches? Why is that important to remember?

Reading 4: Galatians 5:16-26

Living by the Spirit produces the fruit of the Spirit

What does it mean to live by the Spirit? What are the acts of the sinful nature? What is the fruit of the Spirit? How do we produce the fruit of the Spirit?

Reading 5: Proverbs 1:22-33

People who reject God produce bad fruit.

What happens to the person who doesn't listen to God? What happens to the person who listens to God?

Reading 6: 1 Peter 1:22-25 Flower Examination

Read about how a flower produces a seed in an encyclopedia or on the internet. Pict a flower, take it apart, identify and examine its parts, and reflect on its design.

Parent Notes

- **Daily Reading:** Depending on the age and ability of your child, or parent preference, he/she may do the work in this journal independently or complete it with the parent. After reading the day's Bible passage, the student should identify an important truth that relates to that reading and answer the question why he/she needs to know that truth. It would be beneficial if the parent and student also read through and answer the questions about the day's reading from the **Daily Reading Questions** at the back of the booklet. Personal ideas and additional questions from the parent can also be included.
- **Lesson Verse:** The lesson verse which answers the week's big question should be practiced daily. One way to do this is to black out words in the verse each day and say the verse inserting the correct word. By the end of the week the whole verse would be blacked out and recited by memory.
- **Concluding Lesson:** To develop deeper understanding and a comprehensive biblical worldview, the parent should talk through with the student the **Thinking It Through** questions at the back of the booklet and then have the student write out the answers.
- **Completion:** If the student brings this booklet back to the teacher on Sunday, with each day's work completed and the lesson verse memorized, the student will receive acknowledgement of a job well done.
- **Way to go, parents!** Your faithfulness in teaching your children the deed and statutes of the Lord isn't always easy, but it honors God and will have an eternal impact. Keep up the good work! Remember Galatians 6:9, *And let us not grow weary while doing good, for in due season we shall reap if we do not lose heart.*
