NURSERY CONCEPT

We want to grow to be like Jesus.

LESSON CONTENT

Explanation: (Show lesson picture) (picture 6-1)

What is this a picture of?

Every year Jesus' parents went to Jerusalem to celebrate the feast of the Passover like God had said for them to do. This was an important Jewish celebration.

The year Jesus was 12 years old he stayed in Jerusalem and his parents started home without him. They didn't realize that he wasn't with the people they were traveling with.

When his parents went to find him he was in the temple courts listening to the teachers and asking them questions. Everyone who heard him was amazed at his understanding.

Even has a child Jesus did what was right. He learned from God and became wise. He also was obedient to his parents. He showed he was God's Son by the way he lived.

QUESTIONS

Why did Jesus go to Jerusalem? Where did his parents find him? What was he doing?

PRAYER

Thank God that Jesus grew in wisdom and understanding. Pray that you would grow wise as you learn from God's word.
